Question

We attached a second disk to our server. The [ext3](#) file system was created on this disk without partitioning. Can the CDP Server back it up?

Solution

Not for CDP Version 2.x. It requires a disk to have a partition table in order to protect it.

However, this is working well in CDP Version 3.0.
