


Obtaining PXE Network Boot Server

Follow the instructions below to download the appropriate software to perform a Bare-Metal Restore.

To download the PXE Network Boot Server, perform the following steps:

1. The PXE Network Boot Server can be obtained via direct download from the R1Soft website at <http://download.r1soft.com>.

5. When the "Stable Release Downloads" page has loaded, you will see a three-column "Live CD Downloads" table containing the following information:

- Live CD - The file name looks like this: `r1soft-cdp-pxe-server-3.18.2.zip`
